From Pastor Randy...

²⁸ Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. (Matt. 11:28 ESV)

There is an old vaudeville type show that I have seen on TV a few times. It involves a person who takes a pole, one at a time, and stands the pole on end then spins a plate on the pole. As long as the plate is spinning the pole stands. If the plate were to stop spinning the whole thing would fall. The person's big challenge is to start as many new plates spinning while keeping the ones already out there spinning too. This is really no small task, the more plates they have going the more they have to keep running back to. It is inevitable that sooner or later something will fail. It could be that a plate slowed down, that the person spinning things became overwhelmed, or that gravity just made it too tough. – Have you ever felt as though you are the one spinning the plates?

The term we use for this is being busy. When we are busy, we are spinning the plates to keep them going. When we are too busy, we are starting more plates as if we needed to. When we have bitten off more than we can chew, our plates start falling. And when our plates fall our attitude towards others takes a bad turn, we become grumpy, and people tend to notice that we look tired.

In the passage above Jesus is concerned about what plates we are attempting to keep spinning. While he desires for us to keep the truly godly plates going, there are a lot of others that he would soon have us abandon. Why is it that we have such a difficult time doing this? Why is it that so many ungodly things seem to take up so much of our time that we leave little time for God? We do tend to allow the world to dictate our moves. And we also allow the world to keep us busy. What I am saying is that it could be to our detriment.

Under **new business**: Council approved placing a picture donates by the Jason Sullins family in one of the Sunday school classrooms. Merle moved that the meeting be adjourned. Mark seconded the motion. Motion carried. Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.


