

The barter system used and clung to by dealerships is due to the fact that it gives them the best advantage to get the most money out of the buyer. I guess that we should be glad that we don't have to barter for a head of lettuce. The grocery store displays the price of the lettuce and when you take it in your basket to the checker, the price they advertised is what you pay. But that is not the same with a car. The dealership advertises a price and then waits for the negotiations to begin. And they always have more than a few tricks up their sleeves to charge you more.
